There was only one meeting during December due to the snow day earlier in the month. We conducted the Ander and Stress Management lesson. We played a couple ice breaker games to get the students comfortable with each other. Afterwards we did a worksheet from the Boy Scout's Learning for Life Curriculum. The worksheet asked the students to write about a time they were angry. We discussed our sources of anger with the group and productive, positive, healthy ways to cope with anger. We finished the class with some yoga poses.

ScOutreach had two service opportunities in December. First we met at the Harvey House Museum in Belen. The director of the Harvey House, Maureen, started off the service by introducing some of the history behind the museum. Afterwards, the scouts went around the entire building washing windows, window sills, benches and cleaning the floors. They worked fast and efficiently. After the service was finished we were able to tour the museum. The second service of the month was at the Fire House. Fire Fighter and TNT Boxing coach/mentor, David Adame, ran the service. It was really great to have another adult mentor interact with the students and run the community service event. David broke the students into different groups and assigned everyone a task. During the entire three hour period the students rotated jobs between washing the inside and outside of fire trucks, cleaning the fire truck bays, and cleaning the Fire House. David spent time with each participant talking to them about their goals and plans for the future. Overall the service was fun and productive. Students requested partnering with the Fire Department again in the future.
