## YDI VALENCIA TEEN COURT PROGRAM NARRATIVE (FY13)

### DELAYS/BARRIERS

1. Reduction of JPO numbers affecting Teen court referrals.
  - a. Referral process open to Magistrate Court—have received one referral to date.
  - b. Reviewing pilot process to Municipal Court.
2. Holiday schedules continue to increase strain on Teen Court management.
  - a. Teen Court schedule and Guest Judge sign up chart created.—waiting on feedback.
    - i. Schedule meeting with District Court to resolve holiday conflict.

### ACCOMPLISHMENTS/SUCSESSES

1. Teen Court will continue to collaborate with current sanction partners and to seek new/additional sanction partners.
2. MOU finalized sanction slots are being purchased with partners identified.
  - a. New community service locations continue to be identified: Whitfield Wildlife, Care Net Pregnancy.
  - b. Alcohol and Substance Use Education in Belen-pending invoice.
  - c. Victims Impact Panel in Belen-pending invoice from Belen.
    - i. Continue to seek up to date information on additional active VIP providers in Valencia.
  - d. Seeking pre-Driving School resource-Department of Transportation-continue research.
3. Interagency communication between YDI staff and Juvenile Probation Office has improved. Improvement is due to amended procedures and new full time staff.

4. Sent referral process to Los Lunas Municipal Court for review.
5. Referral discussions with The School of Dreams Academy are continuing.
6. Teen Attorney training is scheduled for Saturday April 6. Many students have expressed an interest.
7. ProMIS data entry system training was held at YDI-Valencia on March 26. Devon trained with Philip Griego.
  - a. Devon sent Mr. Griego the Teen Court spread sheet with the information needed to streamline and/or simplify the reporting process. When Mr. Griego makes adjustments to the template, Devon will begin entering data on ProMIS.
8. Researching UNM's School of Law Mock Trial process. Possibility of mentorship for teen attorney volunteers.
