



RESOLUTION NO. 2025-69

AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF CONTRACTS AND MEMORANDA OF AGREEMENT FOR OPIOID REMEDIATION COLLABORATIVE EXPENDITURES AND INITIATIVES

WHEREAS, the Valencia County Board of Commissioners met upon notice of regular meeting, duly published, at the Valencia County Administration Building, 444 Luna Avenue, Los Lunas, New Mexico 87031, on December 17, 2025, at 5:00 P.M. as required by law; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Valencia exercises the powers of the County as a body politic and corporate pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 4-38-1 (1884); and,

WHEREAS, Valencia County serves as the fiscal agent for the Opioid Remediation Collaborative of New Mexico (“Collaborative”), and in that capacity is responsible for executing contracts, memoranda of agreement, and related expenditure documents necessary to implement programs and initiatives approved by the Collaborative Board; and,

WHEREAS, the timely implementation of Collaborative-funded programs requires limited delegation of contracting authority to designated officials, provided that all expenditures or initiatives are first approved by the Collaborative Board; and,

WHEREAS, the implementation of county-specific or regional opioid remediation initiatives may require the execution of memoranda of agreement with Collaborative member counties or with external entities engaged in delivering approved services or programs; and,

WHEREAS, the Board finds that delegating such limited authority is necessary to efficiently implement Collaborative-approved programs and initiatives, and that such authority must remain conditioned on prior approval by the Collaborative Board; and,

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that certain prior actions taken by the Executive Director of the Collaborative or the Valencia County Manager in support of Collaborative-approved expenditures and initiatives were undertaken in good faith and for the benefit of the Collaborative and its member counties; and,

WHEREAS, the Board desires to formally ratify such prior actions to ensure continuity of operations and to avoid any disruption of the programs, contracts, or initiatives funded by the Collaborative.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Valencia County that the Executive Director of the Opioid Remediation Collaborative, or in the alternative the Valencia County Manager, is hereby authorized to execute contracts, purchase orders, amendments, memoranda of agreement, and other documents necessary to carry out Collaborative-approved expenditures and initiatives, provided that each such expenditure or initiative has been approved by the Collaborative Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this authorization applies solely to the implementation of programs, initiatives, and expenditures funded by the Opioid Remediation Collaborative and does not extend to other County programs or County funds, and all such documents shall be maintained in the County's procurement or contract files and be available for Board review upon request.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby ratifies and confirms all prior actions taken by the Executive Director of the Collaborative or the Valencia County Manager that were undertaken in support of expenditures or initiatives previously approved by the Collaborative Board, and such actions shall be deemed valid and enforceable as if taken under the authority of this Resolution.




